About the project:

The Track-Map-Clean project aims to raise awareness about environmental issues produced by inappropriate waste disposal. During this project, we will develop educational and digital tools for youth workers, NGOs and young people to promote environmentally friendly practices and encourage innovative solutions in order to overcome environmental problems.

Objectives:

- Create educational tools to support youth workers in their trainings targeting the development of green skills of young people;

- Raise awareness of the environmental issues caused by waste, among young people;

- Create digital solutions to environmental problems in the youth work field;

- Foster youth civic participation in the development of innovative solutions to overcome environmental problems.

About the LTTA:

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The Learning, Teaching, and Training Activity (LTTA) in the Track-Map-Clean project is an intensive program designed to empower youth workers from partner countries with the knowledge, skills, and resources necessary to effectively address environmental issues, particularly those related to waste management. Through a combination of workshops, training sessions, and hands-on learning experiences, participants will deepen their understanding of environmental sustainability, develop innovative educational approaches, enhance their digital literacy, and foster cross-cultural collaboration. The LTTA aims to equip youth workers with the tools they need to engage and empower young people to become active agents of change in promoting environmentally friendly practices and finding innovative solutions to environmental challenges within their communities. The main objectives of the learning, teaching, and training activity include:

Capacity Building:

Enhance the skills and competencies of youth workers in addressing environmental issues and promoting sustainable practices among young people.

Educational Tool Development:

Collaboratively create educational resources and materials that empower youth workers to effectively train young people on green skills and environmental awareness.

Awareness Raising:

Increase awareness among young people about the environmental impact of improper waste disposal and the importance of adopting eco-friendly behaviors.

Digital Solutions:

Explore and develop digital tools and platforms that facilitate environmental education and encourage innovative approaches to solving environmental challenges within the youth work sector.

Civic Engagement:

Engage youth in active participation and decision-making processes related to environmental issues, encouraging them to contribute to the development and implementation of innovative solutions.

The learning, teaching, and training activity will be designed as a combination of interactive workshops, group discussions, case studies, and practical exercises. It will also incorporate study visits to local organizations and initiatives that promote sustainable and digital practices.

Enhancing skills in facilitating discussions, engaging participants, and communicating environmental concepts clearly.

Digital Literacy:

Improving proficiency with digital tools and resources for educational purposes, including software, online platforms, and multimedia content creation.

Innovative Thinking:

Encouraging creative problem-solving and entrepreneurship among young people to address environmental challenges.

Civic Engagement:

Promoting active participation and empowerment among young people to take positive action in their communities.

Cross-Cultural Competence:

Developing intercultural communication skills and an appreciation for diverse perspectives on environmental sustainability through collaboration with international partners.

With over 2000 years of history, Braga is the oldest city in Portugal and one of the world's oldest catholic cities.

Founded by the Romans in the year 16 b.C. and named "Bracara Augusta" in honor of the emperor Cesar Augusto. It was the capital of Galécia, from which derived five Roman Roads, with a vast territory that went from the North Douro until the Cantabrian. After conquests and re-conquests from several people, the king of Leon, D. Afonso IV donated it as a dowry to his daughter D. Teresa at a time of her wedding with the Count D. Henrique of Burgundy.

The long history of Braga is visible in its monuments and churches, being the Cathedral the most imposing and displaying several different styles, from roman to baroque, also being proud of the splendid houses, particularly the XVIII century ones.

A young, cosmopolitan and multicolor city, Braga shows with confidence a wide range of success and prosperity scenarios, extending its tutelary and entrepreneur arms to areas as vital as the culture, the commerce, industry and services.
